## INDIAN PROVISIONS INCLUDED

### Title XXXI – Affordable Health Choices for All Americans

#### Subtitle D – Shared Responsibility for Health Care

Sec. 163 – Shared Responsibility Payments; (b) Exemptions (3); Pg. 105; lines 11-14

*who is an enrolled member of a federally recognized Indian tribe (as defined in section 4 of the Indian Self-Determination and Education Assistance Act)*

### Title II – Improving the Quality and Efficiency of Health Care

#### Subtitle B – Health Care Quality Improvement;

Sec. 215 – Trauma Care Centers and Service Availability; (a) Trauma Care Centers (1) Grants for Trauma Care Centers; Pg. 281; lines 10-13

*In General – The Secretary shall establish 3 programs to award grants to qualified public, nonprofit, Indian Health Service, Indian tribal, and urban Indian trauma centers*

### Title III – Improving the Health of the American People

#### Subtitle B – Increasing Access to Clinical Preventative Services;

Sec. 311 – Right Choices Program; (i) definitions; Pg. 366; lines 4-9

*In this section, the term “State” means each of the several States, the District of Columbia, and each of the territories of the United States, and shall include Indian tribes and tribal organization (as such terms are defined in section 4(b) and section 4(c) of the Indian Self-Determination and Education Assistance Act).*

#### Subtitle B – Increasing Access to Clinical Preventative Services;

Sec. 314 – Oral Health Improvement; (a) School-Based Sealant Programs; Pg. 378; lines 21-25

*“shall award a grant to each of the 50 States and territories and to Indians, Indian tribes, tribal organization and urban Indian organizations (as such terms are defined in section 4 of the Indian Health Care Improvement Act)”.*

*The Secretary, acting through the Director of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, shall enter into cooperative agreements with State, territorial, and tribal units of government to establish oral health leadership and program guidance...*

Sec. 332 – Understanding Health Disparities: data collection and analysis; Pg. 413; line 1

*The Indian Health Service (authorizes the Secretary to make analysis available to)*

Subtitle C – Increasing the Supply of the Health Care Workforce

Sec. 424 – Public Health Workforce Recruitment and Retention Programs; Pg. 477; lines 15-20

*The Secretary shall establish the Public Health Workforce Loan Repayment Program (referred to in the section as the ‘Program’) to assure an adequate supply of public health professionals to eliminate critical public health workforce shortages in Federal, State, local, and tribal public health agencies.*

Sec. 424 – Public Health Workforce Recruitment and Retention Programs; Pg. 478; lines 3-4

*...and have accepted employment with a Federal, State, local, or tribal public health agency...(eligibility)*

*be employed by, or have accepted employment with, a Federal, State, local, or tribal public health agency or related training fellowship...*

Sec. 425 – Allied Health Workforce Recruitment and Retention Programs; Pg. 482, lines 5-9

*The purpose of this section is to assure an adequate supply of allied health professionals to eliminate critical allied health workforce shortages in Federal, State, local, and tribal public health agencies or in settings where patients might require health care services,*

### Subtitle C – Increasing the Supply of the Health Care Workforce

Sec. 425 – Allied Health Workforce Recruitment and Retention Programs; Pg. 482, lines 23-24

*in a Federal, State, local, or tribal public health agency (qualified employers)*

### Subtitle C – Increasing the Supply of the Health Care Workforce

Sec. 425 – Allied Health Workforce Recruitment and Retention Programs; Pg. 483, lines 22-24

*is employed with a Federal, State, local or tribal public health agency (definition of who is an allied health profession)*

Sec. 426 – Grants for State and Local Programs; Pg. 485, lines 10-14

*The term ‘eligible individuals’ includes those individuals employed in public health positions at the Federal, State, tribal, or local level*

Sec. 434 – Alternative Dental Health Care Providers Demonstration Project; Pg. 510, line 6

*an Indian Health Service facility (an eligible entity)*
